Phoneme Spotter

Choose a sound or rule you are learning to use (for example /ai/). Read a page in a book or text, and find examples of that sound being used. Example:

Train - ai

Away - ay

Take - a-e

Rain - ai

Play - ay

Great - ea

Made - a-e

Came - a-e

They - ey

/ai/:

made, away, take, train, they, great, came

Create a simple poster that explains a spelling rule you have learnt.

The letter 'g' may have a soft or hard sound.
A soft 'g' is usually followed by an 'i' or 'e'.
A hard 'g' is usually followed by a consonant or an 'a', 'o' or 'u'



'g' in 'golf' is hard 'g' in 'gem' is soft
